## How do I safely dispose of my sharps?

This publication is a guide for people with diabetes, haemophilia and other conditions that require sharps disposal.

Councils across the eastern Riverina would like to make sure that sharps are properly disposed of in our communities.

This brochure has been developed with the kind assistance of the Centre for Public Health in order to assist sharps users to dispose of their used sharps safely.

## What are sharps?

### What are "sharps"?

Sharps are objects that are intended for cutting or penetrating the skin.

They include, but are not limited to:

- Needles
- Syringes with a needle
- Intravenous giving sets
- Lancets
- Scalpel blades

### How should I handle my sharps?

People who use sharps should ensure they are stored correctly so that there is no risk of injury to anyone who may come into contact with the used sharps.

As a guide, you should do the following:

- Store sharps in a puncture proof container (preferably a yellow "sharps container")
- Store sharps containers out of reach of children
- When the container is full, seal the lid firmly and take it to your local sharps disposal bin.

## Where can I purchase a sharps container?

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Medical sharps containers can be purchased from:

- Local pharmacies
- Diabetes Australia
- "Fit Packs" (includes "sharps" container) for intravenous drug users are also available from your local pharmacist and local health service.

### How do I dispose of my sharps container?

When the container is full seal the lid firmly and take it to your local hospital or a Community Sharps Disposal Bin (see reverse for locations in the eastern Riverina)

- Do not remove used sharps from the sealed container
